HISTORICAL ROOTS

Throughout the second half of the 19th century in the United States, Protestants of diverse backgrounds began to wonder why their churches didn't seem to exhibit the same vibrant, faith-filled life as those of the New Testament. Many of these believers joined evangelical or Holiness churches, dedicated themselves to fervent prayer and self-sacrifice, and fervently sought God. It was in this context that people began to experience biblical spiritual gifts and Pentecostal revival.

Formed amidst this growing worldwide Pentecostal revival, the Assemblies of God were founded in 1914 in Hot Springs, Arkansas, by a broad coalition of ministers who desired to collaborate to achieve common goals, such as experiencing the move of the Holy Spirit, establishing doctrinal unity, evangelizing the world, sending missionaries, and fostering fellowship and accountability. The Assemblies of God quickly spread to other countries, and today there are nearly 13,000 churches in the United States with nearly 3 million members and worshippers. With more than 86 million members worldwide, the Assemblies of God is the largest Pentecostal denomination in the world.

These achievements bear witness to the fact that a Christ-centered church, rooted in sound doctrine, fulfills divine purposes. May our historical roots inspire us to continue this legacy.



THE FOUR CARDINAL TRUTHS

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Two years after its founding, the Assemblies of God established 16 doctrines as the standard by which preaching and teaching are evaluated. These doctrines became our Statement of Fundamental Truths.

Four of these beliefs are considered the fellowship's fundamental beliefs. We may hear them referred to as our cardinal truths. They permeate all teaching, music, preaching, discussions—everything we do. The message of the Church revolves around these four defining beliefs:

- 1. Salvation Through Jesus Christ
- 2. Divine Healing
- 3. Baptism in the Holy Spirit
- 4. The Second Coming of Christ

During these weeks we will address these four topics.

RELEVANCE TO LIFE

A knowledge of these four cardinal truths is essential for spiritual growth, doctrinal integrity, and effective ministry. These core beliefs provide a biblical foundation that shapes personal faith, guides worship, and influences evangelism. Understanding salvation ensures a strong relationship with Christ and the ability to share the gospel effectively. Believing in divine healing strengthens faith in God's restorative power and helps us face life's storms with steadfastness. The baptism in the Holy Spirit empowers believers for service and deepens their connection with God, while the doctrine of Christ's second coming instills hope and urgency for godly living. These teachings unite believers in purpose, strengthen the church's mission, and empower members to defend their faith with clarity and confidence.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

Upon successful completion of this course, students will have demonstrated the ability to: (1) Know and recite the four cardinal truths of our faith; (2) Incorporate knowledge of these cardinal truths into their daily lives and participation in the Great Commission; (3) equip themselves with additional tools to defend their faith and our church's position on these various issues; (4) Allow these truths to transform their lives and thinking to lead more Christlike lives.


